[Vixen Collective](#), Victoria's recognised peer-only sex worker organisation, and [Scarlet Alliance](#), Australian Sex Workers Association, are participating as stakeholders in the Review into Decriminalisation of Sex Work currently being conducted by the Andrews Labor Government. As part of our best practice for engaging sex worker voices in law reform processes, we recently conducted a series of community consultations with Victorian sex workers, which act as the peer-led accountable feedback mechanism for the sex worker community to ensure that their voices are prioritised in the Review process.

The feedback provided in these consultations and in the current Vixen online survey for Victorian sex workers will inform our submissions as key stakeholders of the Review. Vixen Collective and Scarlet Alliance will also conduct several workshops for individual sex workers wishing to write their own submissions for the review. Over the last few weeks, other individuals and groups have advertised feedback mechanisms for sex workers, creating some confusion amongst Victorian sex workers as to our own association with these processes. Scarlet Alliance and Vixen Collective wish to clarify that we are not associated or involved with any other sex worker feedback processes than those outlined above and badged with our logos.

Scarlet Alliance, Australian Sex Workers Association is the national peak body representing our membership of individual sex workers, sex worker networks, groups, projects, collectives and organisations from around Australia since 1989. Our membership includes Vixen Collective, founded in 2005, as the recognised peer-only sex worker organisation in Victoria. Through our objectives, policies and programs, Scarlet Alliance aims to achieve equality, social, legal, political, cultural and economic justice for past and present workers in the sex industry. This is in order for sex workers to be self-determining agents, building their own alliances and choosing where and how they work.

We have over 30 years experience representing and advocating for sex workers and sex worker rights issues with local, state and national governments, and have developed best practice consultation models informed by our commitment to peer-led advocacy work and the standards set by our objects and our peer educator training program. We are members of the Australian Federation of AIDS Organisations (AFAO), The Asia Pacific Network of Sex Workers (APNSW), and The Global Network of Sex Work Projects (NSWP).
